Hope you're staying safe and warm at home tonight. Here are some actions to keep you going!

### 1. Call

**Call Attorney General Paxton and Governor Abbott and urge them to keep Planned Parenthood.** More background, scripts, and phone numbers can be found in [the CTA section on our website](#).

### 2. Testify

**Sign up to testify at Redistricting hearings.** There are only 3 opportunities left to do this important action! February 19, February 26, and February 27. Remember, you don't have to be an expert to provide testimony, but the number of us that show up will indicate how much pushback constituents will have as maps are redrawn. ### 3. Call

**Call your State Rep and Senator to support legislation that limits methane emissions.** Methane emissions are a significant contributor to climate change, and many are avoidable. Fortunately, several bills have been introduced this legislative session to help curb methane emissions. Make sure your Rep and Senator know that you support these bills: HB 1494 (Rep Goodwin), HB 1521 (Rep Hinojosa), HB 1452 (Rep Rosenthal), HB 1377 (Gonzalez), HB 896, HB 897 (Rep Reynolds), and SB 388 (Sen Eckhardt)
